## *The Paradox of Change*

*But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. ~ Lamentations 3:21-23*



**Anticipating Change.** My family just got a springer spaniel puppy. We knew for several weeks that the puppy would be coming, and we made all the preparations for his arrival. We puppy proofed the house. We bought him a crate and food and water dishes. We bought toys and started leaving them around so Addy and the cat could get used to them. We worked in our yard to make it safe and installed a fence. We talked about what to name him, envisioned how great it would be to have him around, and began to agree on training plans.

I was excited. The last time I had a dog, I was a little girl, and now, I would get to watch Addy grow up with this companion and friend. But, I would be lying if I wasn't also more than a little scared. I didn't know the first thing about raising a puppy and I knew that his presence would change our lives. Frequent trips outside, messes to clean up, teaching him what it meant to be our dog, all sounded daunting and difficult.

**Facing Change.** The first two weeks of our puppy's presence in our lives was extremely difficult. We had to keep track of two babies now and they were often going in different directions. The puppy needed constant supervision and didn't know how to play safely with people. Tom and I both admitted it was a harder transition and job than we thought it would be. For a few weeks, our lives were pure chaos, and we couldn't escape it, because the dog couldn't be left alone for more than a short time.

The only thing that kept me going was knowing that someday, this unruly, unpredictable, ball of fur would be a wonderful dog and companion. One day, he and Addy would be great friends and rely on one another. One day, he would be an integral and cuddly part of our family through good and bad times.

**Embracing Change.** All changes are like this in some capacity. There is the anticipation of a new thing, exciting and alluring. But there is also the fear that change means a new way of living. It means letting go of things that are easy and comfortable and forging new paths that might not only be difficult but also painful as we work through them.

But God's mercies and love never cease. We are not left alone to struggle and we are not without hope. God walks the journey of change with us. As we look at new ways of being church in a changing world, the idea of change and new paths may cause fear and anxiety. But God is with us, and his mercies are new every morning. As we travel through the difficult times, we are assured that the future is God-filled, God-led, and exciting beyond measure.

My family doesn't have it all figured out yet, and we still have a long way to go, but Didi is growing and learning, and so are we as we make changes to become a stronger, bigger, and happier family together.

## Pastor's Pen



*"I was a stranger and you welcomed me..." Matthew 25:35*

Over the last several years much of our news has been dominated by issues related to immigration, migrants, and refugees.

See if these words and phrases sound familiar:

Illegal immigrants, DACA, migrant caravan, deportation, family separation, detention camps, asylum seekers, child separation, refugee crisis, catch and release, The Wall, ICE, undocumented, drivers licenses for illegals (or the undocumented), arrests of Good Samaritans, traffickers, government shut down, border security, coyotes, travel ban, Northern Triangle, gang violence, failed states, etc.

As the Presidential election gets closer the stories and the rhetoric will only increase seeking to roil our emotions and stoke our fears.

What is our response as Christians? I don't have the answers. I do have opinions, but I don't expect all to share my opinions. I think it is OK if we disagree on issues like the proper level of border security, or how many legal temporary workers we allow to enter the US, or what a path to citizenship might look like and who might be eligible.

But whatever our opinions we should never forget that we are talking about human beings made in the image of God, people for whom Jesus went to the cross, children whom Jesus blesses. These are our brothers and sisters. I believe it is our responsibility as Christians to resist the forces in government, politics and media that would dehumanize any child of God.


### **Sending Our High School Grads Off in Comfort**




